R.N.B.C. QUEEN

Formed in ARMADILLO May 1943, and prepared for overseas service which did not materialize in July 1943. After further exercises the unit went into Winter Quarters with No.10 Beach Group at Ayr Racecourse, where it remained until its transfer to Inverary in March 1944 to participate in 50th Divisions refresher Assault Course.

Proceeded via Armadillo to join Force 'G' at Portland with whom it proceeded to Normandy in June 1944. One Officer and 2 P.O. were wounded on D Day.

Returned to Armadillo August 22nd and from there proceeded to Lowestoft at the end of September 1944.
